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What is NAAS?

- NAAS is a voluntary accreditation for child and family social workers and Practice supervisors. It is a:
- National benchmark of good practice
- Tool to encourage employers to embed the KSS and improve professional development
- Tool to enhance the expertise and knowledge of social workers



How is NAAS being rolled out

- NAAS is now live with assessment centres being run in a number of Local Authority areas
- The Department for Education is working with a number of Local Authorities and children's trusts to introduce NAAS with a phased approach
- Phase 1 has been taking place since July 2018 and the learning has informed the roll out of phase 2
- We are one of 56 Local authorities invited to be an early adopter and participate in phase 2
- National roll out is expected in 2020




Middlesbrough's Approach

Assessment Centre

- Assessment centres can accommodate up to nine social workers so you can sign up with colleagues
- Local centres are run in Darlington (TBC)
- The day runs with three groups of three starting at different times
- Each group takes around four hours from start to finish which includes regular breaks
