- We never give up


How TCES Group works



- Formed as a Social Enterprise
- Mission before profits = significant additional resources for R&D into what really works for these children
- Reinvestment into clinical services
- EHC from beginning (well before introduced generally)
- Unteachable children? We don't believe it!
 We now have a solution that we know works for these children

Our Children and Young People



- Backgrounds SEMH and/or ASC
- Comorbidity and complexity of our pupils and their multiple placement attachment issues
- Schools Tiers 2 & 3
- Create Service Tiers 3 & 4
- High risk or high vulnerability precluding them from initially being taught in a small group special school environment
- C/YP at extreme end of Create Service often well known to everyone in the LA

Our C/YP cont...



- Externalising boys and some girls 5-11 yrs with ongoing CP issues (possibly LAC)
- 11-16 yrs with ASD, presenting occasional fixated behaviour and high anxiety, yet areas of academic potential
- 11-16 yrs with ASC presentation co-morbidity, ie MH issues/school phobias/morbid obsessions/radicalisation
- Girls 7-16 yrs with vulnerability to CSE possibly LAC
- Boys 7-16 yrs with SHB against younger children
- 11-16 yrs (mostly boys, some girls) prolific youth offending, extreme risk in the community, hidden undiagnosed SEN needs






