LA responsibility and Support Services



Lead Training & Consultancy

- The Local Authority is required to make provision of support services for Special Guardians.
- These include:
 - Counselling, advice, information;
 - Support Groups for children, parents and Special Guardians;
 - Help with contact arrangements between child and parents and relatives;
 - Therapy services for the child;
 - Training for the Special Guardian;
 - Respite care;
 - Mediation;
 - Financial support.
- The support services should be similar to those available to adopters and potential adopters.

Research



- Hall (2008) significant orders made to Legitivity & Consultancy extended family members
- Wade et all (2010) 86% made to family and friends form 2005-2007.
- Wade et all (2014) reinforced earlier studies.
- SGO on increase


SGO on increase



- 2010- 1290 SGOs
- 2011-2011 SGOs mostly to relatives, grandparents or children settled in placement.
- 2014- 3330 SGOs
- 2015- 5300 SGO granted (81% increase since 2011)








The Special Guardianship (Amendment) Regulations 2016

passed on 02 February 2016 and apply the story assessments commenced after 29 February 2016.

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About the child



- "any harm suffered which the child has suffered suffered
- any risk of future harm to the child posed by the child's parents, relatives or any other person the local authority consider relevant;"
- "a description of the child's personality, his social development and his emotional and behavioural development and any related current or in the likely future"


The prospective Special Guardians



- "an assessment of the nature of the prospective special guardian's current and past relationship with the child"
- "their understanding of, and ability to meet the child's current and likely future needs, particularly, any needs the child may have arising from harm that the child has suffered;
- their understanding of, and ability to protect the child from any current or future risk of harm posed by the child's parents, relatives or any other person the local authority consider relevant, particularly in relation to contact between any such person and the child;
- their ability and suitability to bring up the child until the child reaches the age of eighteen;".

No jargon, use plain language


