

Strengths-based, relationship approach, that keeps children and families at the centre of our practice.



SYSTEMIC PRACTICE

Considers the whole picture: the person, their family, community and wider society.



TRAUMA INFORMED

Helps us to recognise and respond to young people and families who may have experienced trauma and adversity.
